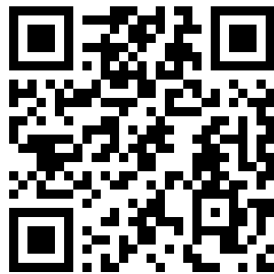

The iota subscript appears beneath the vowels α, η, and ω. It occurs only at the end of a syllable, usually at the end of a word. In Koine Greek it is not pronounced, but it is important in spelling and grammar.

Accent marks appear above vowels (or the second vowel of a diphthong) and indicate how a word is pronounced. Their primary purpose is to show the syllable that receives the accent. While accents usually do not change the meaning of a word, they can sometimes distinguish between different words or grammatical forms. Koine Greek uses three types of accents:

Acute ( ´ )	example: ᾶ
Circumflex ( ˘ )	example: ᾷ
Grave ( ` )	example: ἄ
